Pepelino is a reflection tool that intends to promote language and intercultural learning. It is valuable for developing consciousness about own practices and own development. It is valuable for planning for children's learning, because it guides the pre-primary teacher to see the child and his/her own practices as an interwoven activity. Pepelino can turn "bad" practice into "good" practice, mostly because it guides the student stepwise into the field of language and intercultural education.
