# What is the STAIRS project?



- The STAIRS, (Stakeholders Together Adapting Ideas to Readjust Local Systems to Promote Inclusive Education) project was launched on 31 January 2019 and lasts for about 3 years.
- The project focusses on the adaptation of good practices in the field of social inclusion across Europe and on the adaptation process itself. The Tempus Public Foundation is participating in the project as a coordinating institution and 6 other institutions (7 institutions from 6 countries, Czech Republic, Croatia, Slovenia, Ireland, Portugal and Hungary, in total) are cooperating on the project.
- General objective of the project is disseminating and scaling up good practices on inclusive learning to the Europena level

### Who are the key target audiences?



- The primary target groups are policy makers and authorities at the local, regional, national levels as well as at EU level.
- Further target groups are practitioners working with disadvantaged communities, youth organisation representatives, service providers, educational experts, school leaders, teacher trainers, teachers, parents and students.
