Summary

Bridge to Terabithia tells the story of an unlikely friendship between an artistic boy, Jess, from a poor rural family and an imaginative young girl, Leslie, the only daughter of two successful fiction writers. The two young friends create an imaginary world where they escape the cruelty of their fellow classmates and learn to believe in themselves. In their imaginary world, they can conquer everything, including tragedy.
