WEEKS 1-3:

THE CREATION OF A SELF-PORTRAIT

A PRESENTATION OF A MEDIA PROJECT IN ENGLISH CLASS.

TASK:

Using your composite art photo from weeks 10 and 11 as a point of departure you are going to:

- 1. Orally present the process of making the montage technique self-portrait (sound file)
- 2. Write a text (in the genre of your choice: poem, letter, diary entry, short story, newspaper article, song, etc.)
 - a. either inspired by the photo
 - b. or describing the story behind the initial idea of making this particular photo
- 3. Make a multimodal presentation, a digital poster, comprising the composite art photo, the sound file, and the text. Make sure the layout of the poster reflects the message of the self-portrait or the text inspired by the portrait. You are going to use the digital tool called GLOGSTER for this purpose.

SCHEDULE:

Week 1: Studying a text about taking photos and using lighting in the process in order to acquire a basic set of vocabulary
Week 2:
Monday: Introduction to the task and getting started with the carrying out phase.
Tuesday: Individual work at home. Translating your log from making the self-portrait into English, practice reading it and then record and save it it for later use and / or begin writing the text inspired by the composite art photo. Hand in your work by 11:59 p.m in the folder called *Draft week 2*.
Week 3:

Monday: Continue work from Tuesday last week

Tuesday: Creating the digital poster – the Glog. You are going to compile the sound file, the text and the image into a creative multimodal presentation. Make sure you get a

user name and password from your teacher.

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ASSESSMENT:

You will be assessed on your oral competence (the sound file), your writing skills (the written text) and your digital abilities (the multimodal digital poster)

Also, you will be asked to reflect on your own learning process through writing a teacher's instruction text (see separate file).

- read and write texts related to his/her own education programme
- produce composite texts using digital media
