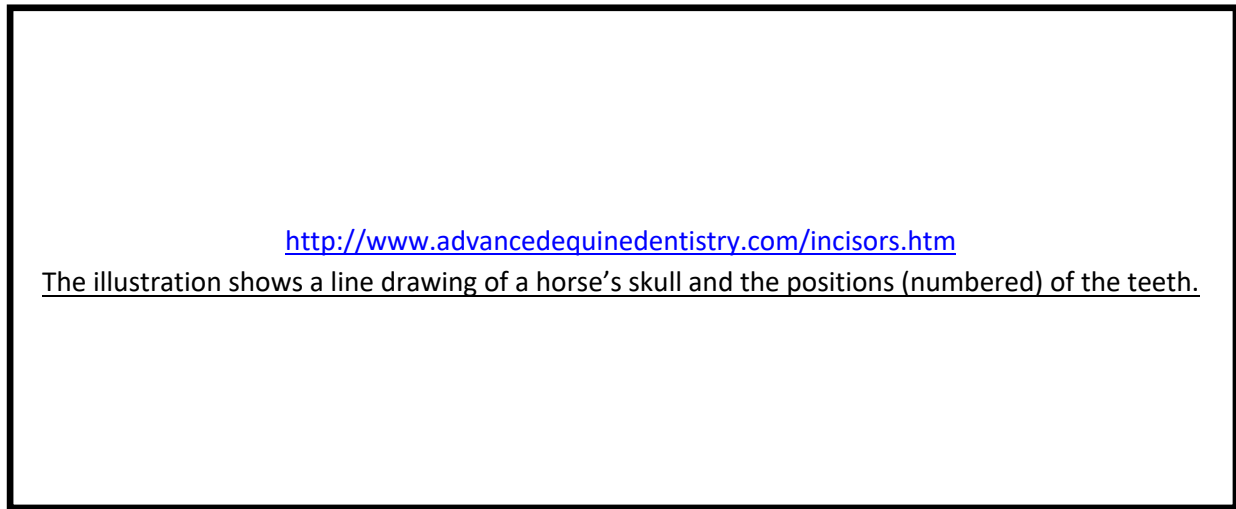


# Worksheet 1. The Horse Dentist is Coming!

→ **Vocabulary:**

<p><b>Equine</b> – connected with horses (Cambridge Dictionary definition)</p> <p><u>Teeth:</u></p> <p>Molars – grinding teeth (6 – 11 on diagram)</p> <p>Incisors – front teeth (1 – 3 on diagram)</p> <p>Canines – male horses only; for fighting! (4 on diagram)</p> <p>Wolf teeth – vestigial teeth. (5 on diagram)</p> <p>Deciduous (milk teeth) – baby teeth!</p> <p><b>Vestigial</b> – describes something that has not developed completely or has stopped being used and has almost disappeared (Cambridge Dictionary definition).</p>	<p><u>Problems that may occur:</u></p> <p>Sharp edges – also called enamel cusps. Develop naturally over time.</p> <p>Milk teeth problems</p> <p>Wolf teeth problems</p> <p>Hooks and ramped molars – when molars are not aligned properly the teeth are not worn down evenly.</p> <p>Overbite (parrot mouth) – top incisors stick out too far forward of bottom incisors</p> <p>Under bite – bottom incisors stick out too far forward of top incisors</p> <p>Missing teeth and decayed teeth</p> <p><b>Align</b> – to put two or more things into a straight line</p>
