- 9. Describe a typical gravity racer.
- 10. Read about more advanced gravity racers and explain the difference between a basic and a more sophisticated vehicle.
- 11. What have you learnt about the history of go-cart races?
- 12. Study "Physics Considerations" and find out what improvements can make your car faster. List your findings here.
