Write an essay on **ONE** of the three topics below.

- 1. What are some of the main intercultural themes in *Funny in Farsi* (2003) by Firoozeh Dumas? Which of these themes would you highlight in a group of 10th graders and why? Use the quotation below as your starting point.
 - On a dozen occasions, invitations addressed to "Mr. and Mrs." came back announcing that six would be attending. Since our wedding was taking place in the summer, our guests who themselves had houseguests decided to just bring them along. We invited 140 people, 163 accepted; 181 showed up (p.144).
- 2. Holden Caulfield's relationship to his siblings is essential in *The Catcher in the Rye* (1951) by J.D. Salinger. How do you link these relationships to the main themes of the book?

- 1. Why is the American government structured the way it is? Explain the three-part structure of the US federal government, discuss how it was influenced by the struggles and ideals of the American people, and consider the effect it has on the country today.
