Term Paper

The term paper presents a didactic scheme for using literature for children and young adults in the classroom. The teaching scheme must have a theoretical grounding. The paper should be between 7-12 pages long and written in English.

Further specifications:

- Use Times New Roman, Font Size 12, with 1 or 1 ½ line spacing.
- You have to include a bibliography. Table of contents and any appendices come in addition to the paper itself.
- As your theoretical point of departure, choose one of the themes (Literacy, Health and Life Skills, Democracy and Citizenship) that you have not already discussed in Task 1 and Task 2.
- Choose one or more of the primary literary works you have included in your Primary Reading List as the subject for your didactic scheme. You should be able to relate this work/these works to the goals stated in the national curriculum for English in your country (Norway/Sweden) in some way as well as to the theoretical themes we have studied.
- Use the referencing style APA (American Psychological Association) for your bibliography. Use parenthetical references in your text; footnotes may be used for extra information that doesn't fit in with the flow of your text. See the "OWL at Purdue" for guidelines for referencing styles.

 You can also use the HiØ library pages on APA.
- You are expected to carry out an independent literature search and include sources for your topic that go beyond the course curriculum.

When it comes to the lay-out of your paper:

- Remember the basic structure of any paper, no matter how short or long: introduction
 body conclusion.
- Remember to include a clear thesis statement in your introduction and an overview of what you plan to do in your paper.
- In the body of your essay you may want to use the standard didactic organizers WHAT
 WHY HOW to organize your thoughts. (Here the WHY section seems the appropriate place to expand upon theory).
- Your conclusion should sum up what you have said in your paper and include reflection on and discussion of aspects of your scheme that you think are particularly important (possibilities for differentiation, problems you might run into, how the theoretical basis of your paper has influenced your choice, etc.).
- Hand in your final version of your paper by 23:59 on 13 December 2020.
